The newly opened Shevington Community and Recreation Centre (SCRC) is the result of over 10 years of Community involvement to provide the people of Shevington Community a place to improve everyone's Lifestyle. Recently, SCRC were approached by the Rugby League World Cup Organising Committee and the Rugby Football League to be involved in a pilot project to build on the relationship between SCRC and the Community. A virtual meeting was arranged for 8 October with attendees from RFL, RFL World Cup, Wigan Council, My Life, Local Schools, Local Doctors and Patient Support Groups and Shevington Parish Council to investigate how the SCRC can be of greater use to the Community. The result of the well attended meeting was the realisation of an exciting opportunity, led by the Community,

with support from key experienced people from sport and activity sectors.

These sectors work to use 'activities' of all kinds as a catalyst for sustainable and positive change to peoples' lives. The aim is to make the SCRC a "Community Wellbeing Hub" from where numerous 'activities' can be organised and led. The potential and opportunities are endless from: the pitches, the allotments, the building itself, the community, the walks and the varied associations surrounding and supporting YOUR community. Greater Manchester Clean Air Zone

You may have noticed some new signs appearing at the boundaries of Wigan Council with neighbouring councils outside Greater Manchester. They relate to the Clean Air Zone due to be introduced on 30 May 2022. The charging zone will cover the whole of Greater Manchester and will apply to all commercial vehicles that use fossil fuels. Private cars, motorbikes and mopeds will not be affected, but some vehicles that do not meet emissions standards

will be charged to drive in the Zone, which is designed to protect everyone's health by bringing harmful nitrogen dioxide air pollution at the road side within legal limits as soon as possible. For more information, please visit www.cleanairgm.com.

RHS 'In Bloom' Awards 2021 - aidn't they do well?

Congratulations to all of the volunteer 'in Bloom' groups in the Parish! The awards for all categories were presented on Monday, 15 November. Two representatives from each group were invited to attend the ceremony, which was held in Wigan. The Parish Council was represented by Cllr Chris Horridge, who accepted an award on behalf of the Council for Shevington Memorial Park, which gained 'Gold' in the Small Parks category.
