resumed last year a number of footbridges and walkways have been either built or reinstated, improving our enjoyment of the woods.

As some residents will know by now, one of the new footbridges was vandalised in recent weeks. The volunteers repaired it in February. Luckily, the vandals did not damage the frame of the bridge, so it was not overly expensive to fix. But, if one of the bridges were to need replacing altogether, the local branch of the Groundwork Trust, which is a not for profit organisation, would not be able to afford it.

Not only have the volunteers had to contend with vandalism, but they have also been faced with several storms since they repaired the footbridge. Unfortunately, there were a few storm damaged trees in Elnup Wood after the storms at the end of February. The long boardwalk at the bottom was impassable, and the path down the slope from the mine carts had to be closed off completely. They are working to sort things out as soon as possible, but for now they have asked people to please steer clear of the affected areas.

These episodes have not deterred the small, but dedicated, band of local volunteers and they will continue with their efforts to look after the woods.
