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Parish Council report

Elaine led a minutes silence at our meeting in memory of the clerk to PC, Krystyna Pilkington following her sudden death last week .Her funeral will take place at St Bernadette's on Tuesday 10th December at 10.30am. All are welcome to attend.

John's report from the meeting on 30th October:

October 30 the Full Council. We approved the appointment of Ms Sarah Stephenson, Mr Mark Tomlinson and Mr Philip Valentine as co-opted members of the Policy & General Purposes Committee.

It was reported that the organisation, Friends of Shevington Memorial Park, had closed. The balance of its funds were transferred to the Parish Council's accounts to be ring-fenced for the Memorial Park project.

Arrangements for Remembrance Sunday were confirmed.

The regular donation of £600 for the maintenance of St Anne's churchyard was approved. Although St Anne's is an Anglican church, its graveyard is for all members of the parish, whether of the Christian faith, any other faith, or no faith at all.

November 6th Policy and General Purposes Committee. The planting of a tree in memory of Dr John Surman on the grassed area opposite the Hospice Shop was discussed; also the planting of a tree to commemorate the 40th anniversary of the Garden Club.

The Allotment Policy and the Tenancy agreement for allotments do not coincide. It was decided to change the wording of the Tenancy Agreement so that it reflected that of the policy.

There was a discussion about Christmas tree decorations at the Woodnook Road open space. Friends of Stockley Park have offered to help with this.

November 6th Finance Committee. It was decided to replace the three Platinum Jubilee trees which have died. There was a discussion about allotment rents from April 2025.

Crooke Village Residents Association have submitted an application for a grant to assist with flood defences in Crooke Village.

The Full Council meeting for November 27th has been cancelled.

There will be a Full Council meeting on Wednesday, 4th December, for elected councillors only (it's a confidential meeting), to chart the way forward.

Locations will be varied, from the Charnley Arms, Standish Leisure Centre and Appley Bridge, depending on uptake etc. The 4 bird boxes are due to be put up, hopefully this weekend, ready for the birds to roost in over winter and as potential nesting boxes for spring. They are hoping to get the new raised beds filled over the next week.. Because of vandalism of a picnic bench, they are waiting the results of a funding application for two new picnic benches, also from Supporting Communities' fund.

Marlaine said Techmates will be on 6th and 20th December during Methodist coffee morning. The Football and rugby club are supporting the Bricks,' Help Fill a Plate' appeal and the building on Vicarage Lane will be open from 10-12 on Saturday to accept donations. There will also be a stall at Standish Christmas Markets. She also noted that the digital screen in the library porch is up and running. Well done to John for his perseverance.
